Footnote 12 of Esarey (2018), "What makes someone a political methodologist," contains a minor error. The footnote states that $CF = f_{PA}/(f(APSR) + \varepsilon)$ determines the size and color of the word in Figure 2. In fact, the size and color is determined by $f_{PA} \times (f_{PA}/(f(APSR) + \varepsilon))$; that is, the original relative frequency of the word in *Political Analysis* is reweighted by the comparative frequency ratio CF. This is reflected in the existing replication codebase.
